National Initiative for Skill-Integrated Higher Education (NISHE)

Overview

The National Initiative for Skill-Integrated Higher Education (NISHE) aims to enhance the employability of over 1 lakh students enrolled in non-professional degree programs across 1,500+ colleges in 10 states over the next three years. Operating at zero cost to state governments, NISHE supports the professionalization of general education by aligning with the University Grants Commission's Guidelines for Apprenticeship-Embedded Degree Programs (AEDPs). Its core objective is to integrate skill development into mainstream higher education.

Strategy

State-Led Implementation:

NISHE is driven by State Governments, who tailor implementation to local needs and priorities, ensuring regional relevance and ownership.

CRISP's Enabling Role:

CRISP enables effective execution by collaborating with Sector Skill Councils on curriculum and faculty development, and with BOATs for managing apprenticeships and evaluations.

Progress Monitoring & Student-Centric Focus:

CRISP's central and state teams use the NISHE MIS platform to track progress, enable timely interventions, and ensure the program aligns with student aspirations.

Major Highlights

- A draft MoU between the State Governments and Boards of Apprenticeship Training (BOATs) has been finalized and shared with BOAT-Northern and Southern Region and BOPT for Review
- Admissions for AY 2025-26 are now open in Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha and Telangana.
- IEC activities are being conducted to promote AEDPs among prospective students
- Engagement terms with Life Sciences Sector Skill Development Council have been clearly defined.

Status as on date (30th April 2025)

As on date, in total, 5755 students are pursuing AEDPs across 174 colleges in 06 states spanning across 09 sectors (Retail, Logistics, Tourism, Healthcare, Fashion Design, Life Sciences, BFSI, Electronics and Media & Entertainment).

Challenges Faced



The demanding task of restructuring Bihar's curriculum and credit framework for its State Conventional Universities continues to be a key focus. While CRISP has completed the initial development and submitted the curricula for review, the progress to achieve final alignment and implementation remains a challenge.

Addressing Himachal Pradesh University's curriculum in line with NEP 2020 remains a critical challenge. Local experts are supporting the redesign to align with their state specific needs.

Key Learnings and Way Forward



- Early and deep engagement with state-specific requirements and local experts is crucial for successful curriculum adaptation.
- A meeting has been proposed between the Secretary, Ministry of Education and the BOATs to be also attended by CRISP Leadership to finalize MoU terms and conditions.
