AEDPs Admissions: AY 2023-24

Telangana

- 26 Colleges are implementing 08 different AEDPs in the state.
- 1160 students (693 male & 467 female) are pursuing in these colleges.
- In AY 2024-25, we are expanding to 97 colleges.



Uttar Pradesh



- 21 Colleges from 07 Universities received AEDP implementation approvals.
- 36 Students are pursuing BBA Retail Operations in 03 colleges.
- Owing to late approvals and delayed academic sessions,
 remaining colleges opted to implement AEDPs from AY 2024-25.
- In AY 2024-25, we are expanding to 74 colleges.






