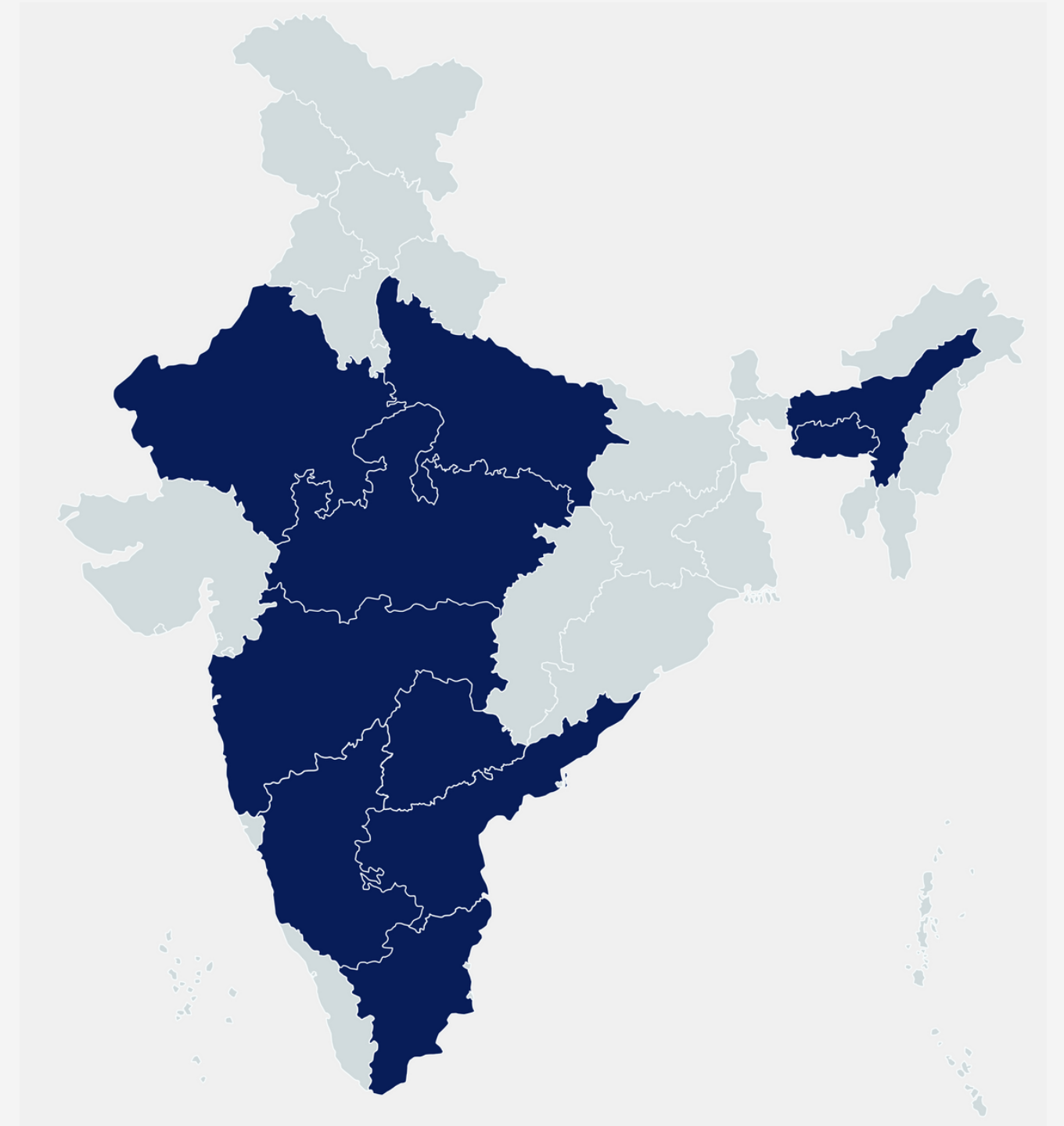

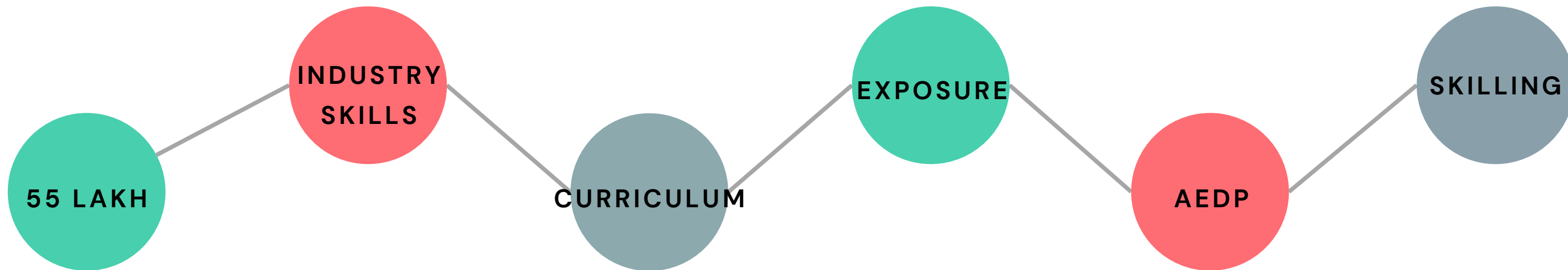

Issues at Hand

General Degree Students not equipped with industry-demand skills to capture employment opportunities.

Hands-on work exposure becomes an imperative during degree program.

Sustainable skilling vs Short-term skilling – former is preferable.



About 1 crore B.A., B.Sc. & B.Com. students pass out annually with 55 lakh unemployed.

Require curriculum re-orientation to integrate skill sets as stated in NEP.

Combination of industry-led skills & apprenticeship woven into a degree program as per UGC guidelines is the way forward.

3-year or 4-year Apprenticeship Embedded Degree Program (AEDP) with Deep Skills for the students of Non-Professional/Conventional Degree Colleges.



SECTOR SKILL COUNCILS

Provision of Curriculum, Training of Teachers, Apprenticeship and Assessment.



STATE GOVERNMENT

Ownership of the Project, Selection & Approval of Colleges, Making Faculty available for Training.



UNIVERSITY

BoS Approval, Exams Conduction, Award of Degree.



COLLEGES

Take Approvals for new Courses, Provide Classrooms & Labs, Assessment as per Schedule, Monitor the Project.

AEDPs Admissions : AY 2023-24

Telangana

- 26 Colleges are implementing 08 different AEDPs in the state.
- 1160 students (693 male & 467 female) are pursuing in these colleges.
- In AY 2024-25, we are expanding to 97 colleges.



Uttar Pradesh



- 21 Colleges from 07 Universities received AEDP implementation approvals .
- 36 Students are pursuing BBA Retail Operations in 03 colleges.
- Owing to late approvals and delayed academic sessions, remaining colleges opted to implement AEDPs from AY 2024-25.
- In AY 2024-25, we are expanding to 74 colleges.

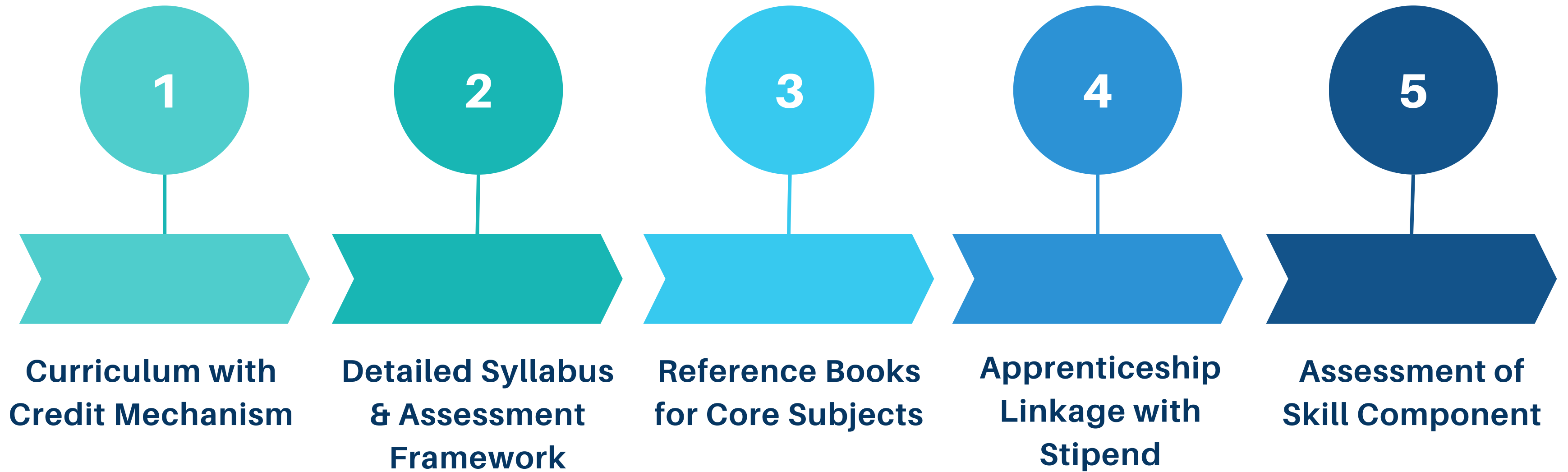

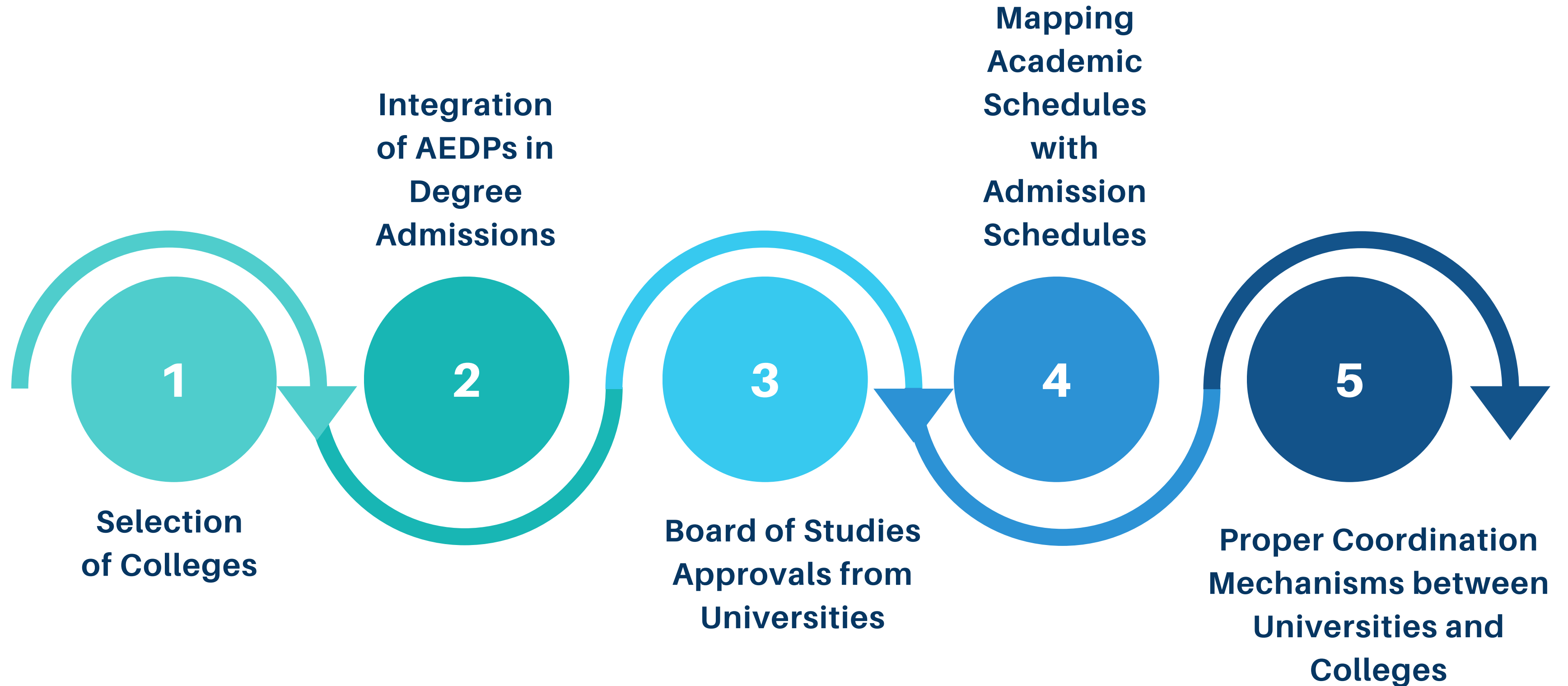
