Sub: Village Immersion Visit: Insights into Development (VIVID) Landscapes

In the month of April-May 2024, all the CRISP Fellows have undetaken village immersion with the following objectives:

- a) Improve understanding of rural India & Learn how to interact with people
- b) Study how the major schemes (MGNREGS, NRLM, SBA, SS) are implemented.
- c) Understand the organisation of the rural poor women into SHGs and their functioning
- d) Understand the functioning of Gram Panchayats and the GPDP.
- e) Understand the performance of institutions at the grassroot level: school, PHC, Anganwadi.

The visit was to encourage the Fellows to understand life from the perspective of a villager. This includes getting to know the living conditions, livelihood, challenges, struggles and achievements, etc. in a village community.
